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#### **Safety steps**

#### **Safety points**

Collect equipment:

- Non-sterile gloves
- A clean container
- · Alcohol-based wipe
- B Take equipment to the patient's bedside

Ensure hands are clean before starting task

## Moments 1 and/or 2 hand hygiene<sup>1</sup>

If the patient or bed area is touched prior to handling the outlet tap remove gloves and repeat hand hygiene (Moment 2) before Step C

- 1. Put on clean gloves and apron
  - 2. Empty the urine into the clean container ensuring the *key part*<sup>2</sup> is protected
- 1. Close the tap
  - 2. Disinfect\* the outlet tap
  - Go directly to toilet or sluice to measure and discard urine
  - 2. Decontaminate/dispose of the urine container as local policy
- F Remove gloves and apron

Removing urine from the outlet tap reduces risk of bacterial growth

If urine cannot be discarded immediately, perform Step F and hand hygiene (Moment 3) prior to starting any other task

\* e.g. using alcohol-based wipe
